ately decided to take part in the rally. "Since childhood, I was fascinated by SUVs and purchased my dream car only few months ago. The rally made my Sunday full of adventure."

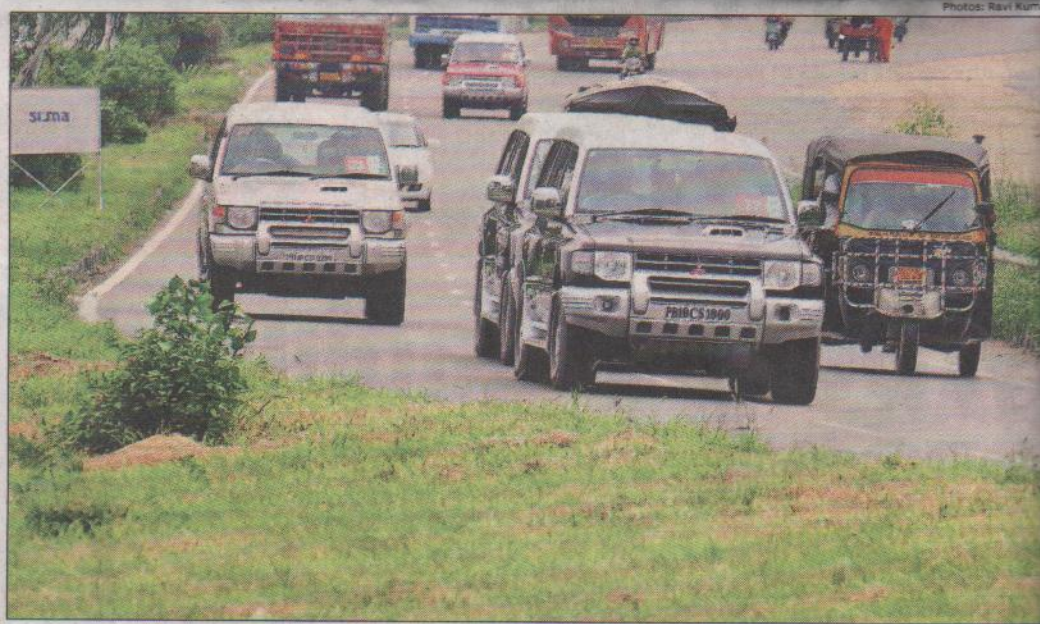
